The UoR-NUIST partnership



- Nanjing University of Information Science and Technology, founded 1960
- Focus on teaching and research in meteorology and climate
- Relationship with UoR from 2009

- Joint institute established in 2015
- Significant numbers of students transfer to Reading from 2015
- 90 expected to transfer for September 2018



COMMON CHALLENGES EXPERIENCED BY INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- English language skill and academic literacy
- Difficulty in adjusting to UK academic system and life
- Adjusting to different food/culture/lifestyle/ language
- High academic and financial pressure
- Lack of integration feelings of isolation
- Not seeking support until too late or in crisis
- Difficulty with post-graduation employment



ADDED DIFFICULTIES FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS...

- Problems accessing pre-arrival information
- Unwillingness to explore extra-curricular activities
- Finding friends on the course
- No easing into the degree everything counts!



EASING THE TRANSFER EXPERIENCE – MEETING HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Simplified application document
- Dedicated admissions staff
- Communication with Academy staff on WeChat
- Information on UoR module options while in Nanjing
- Multiple Welcome Week events organised by Schools
- Block booking for visa extension appointments
- Specific welcome event hosted by a UoR VIP



ENCOURAGING INTEGRATION

- More summer schools at UoR
- Central funding for UoR students to visit NUIST during Year 2
- Credit-bearing field trips to Nanjing
- Emphasis on Welcome Week activities



IMPROVING LEARNING OUTCOMES

- IELTS training for staff
- Advice from EAP specialists about setting examination questions for international students
- Dedicated international tutors
- Introduction of a laboratory pre-sessional for chemists
- Academic English module for the chemists
- Dissertation writing workshop for the economists
- Planning around giving transfer students a voice course reps, feedback meetings
