




### A DIFFERENT PICTURE BY REGION

#### ASIA AND AFRICA DOMINATE TOP TEN HOST COUNTRIES FOR UK HE TNE BY STUDENT NUMBERS

- 5 countries with the most UK HE TNE consistent 2014-15 to 2015-16
- pattern replicated within region
- countries in Asia make up the majority of student numbers in 3 out of 5 TNE types
- COLLABORATIVE PROVISION IS THE NORM WITH ASIA HOSTING THE MOST (63%)
  - most noticeable in established TNE locations
  - proxy for measuring growth in joint, dual, double, multiple or concurrent degree
- ASIA AND THE MIDDLE EAST HOST OVER 90% OF THE LEARNERS STUDYING FOR AN AWARD OF THE REPORTING PROVIDER (OTHER THAN CAMPUSES)
- OVERSEAS CAMPUSES MOST PREVALENT IN ASIA (59%) AND THE MIDDLE EAST (32%)
  - 29 UK universities have offshore campuses; there are 39 UK offshore campuses
  - recent drive in overseas governments inviting new campuses
  - EU countries host some of the largest student cohorts by single campuses
- DISTANCE, FLEXIBLE AND ONLINE LEARNING IS INCREASING A QUARTER IN AFRICA, A FIFTH IN ASIA, A FIFTH IN THE EU
  - most noticeable in emerging TNE locations












## **SCALE OF UK HE TNE PARTNERSHIPS**

- No one data source
- Some overseas agencies collect data on TNE programmes hosted in country
- HESA does not disaggregate partnerships / single institution TNE
- UK universities public information (meeting B10)
  - 1,942 international partnerships that could be classified as TNE
  - Most commonly recorded partnership type is articulation, followed by franchise and validation
  - There is a next 'group' of 'multiple input' programmes which includes dual/double degree arrangements and joint programmes

#### WHAT IS ODA?

Official development assistance (ODA) is defined by the OECD Development Assistance Committee (DAC) as government aid that promotes and specifically targets the economic development and welfare of developing countries. The DAC adopted ODA as the "gold standard" of foreign aid in 1969 and it remains the main source of financing for development aid.


